<u>SUMMER ASSIGNMENT</u>: In addition to reading for pleasure, every student entering third grade is required <u>read (2) books from the attached list and complete (2) assignments of your choice</u> from the list below. All these titles can be found on Axis 360 through the student portal.

Your child's teacher will collect the two (2) completed assignments during the first two weeks of the 2021-22 school year. The assignments <u>will</u> be graded.

Directions: From the list below, choose and complete (1) activity for each book that you have read during the summer. You must choose a different activity for each book.

- Use i-Movie or another video platform to create a book trailer advertising your book so someone else will want to read it.
- Create a PowerPoint "pitch" to a producer explaining why the story or the concept would or would not make a great movie.
- Use Flipgrid to report live from the scene in your story. Report the events that have taken place, ask questions, and give background information.
- Use Google Forms or Office 365 Forms to create a quiz for the book you read.
- Make a poster (9x12) advertising your book so someone else will want to read it.
- Create a collage around themes or characters in the book.
- Write a character diary, writing at least five journal entries as if you are the main character in the story. Write down events that happen during the story and reflect on how they affected the character and why.
- Send a postcard from one of the characters. Draw a picture on one side; write the message on the other.
- Create a timeline of the major events in your book. Use drawings or magazine cutouts to show the events along the timeline. Label each event.

Be creative, informative, bold, and dynamic in your presentations! We can't wait to see what you put together for your Summer Reading Projects. Have a great summer!
